Most of Christina's proudest equestrian accomplishments have come aboard horses she partially or wholly developed herself. But equally important has been helping her students to achieve their own goals, particularly through encouraging them to pursue compassionate horsemanship principles every day. Her instruction focuses on improving the quality of relationship and connection between horse and rider through adherence to classical principles. She is a U.S. Equestrian Federation "R" Connemara judge, a U.S. Dressage Federation "L" program graduate and bronze medalist, and a U.S. Pony Club graduate B-EV/H-A. Christina currently serves as the president of the NH Horse Council, co-chair of the USPC Examiners Committee, and is on the USPC Horse Welfare Task Force.
